Its construction will transform the organization, the village, and the town, forever changing the arts landscape of Long Island.

Since 2008, Patchogue Arts Council has established itself as one of Long Island's preeminent arts organizations strengthening the Long Island cultural arts landscape, supporting the local community, and helping revitalize Patchogue Village. With each successive year, PAC has made increasingly lauded advances increasing participation and broadening opportunities for artistic engagement by artists and their audiences.

PAC has accomplished remarkable achievements In concert with this community through partnerships with other organizations that have amplified PAC's sphere of influence and service (e.g. Exploring Art Therapy for the first time with SEPA Mujer and their Thriving Latinas program with the support of the Department of Justic); advocating, and providing opportunities for local artists (e.g. Acting as Public Art Consultant for Patchogue Village); expanding exhibition opportunities (e.g. Satellite exhibitions all across Downtown



Patchogue}; and emerging as an invaluable resource for educators and teaching artists across Long Island via launching PAC's first large-scale educational program in 2022 called Partners in Education, Arts, and Community Empowerment which was fully funded by the United States Department of Education. We are one of only of 27 organizations across the U.S. that received this grant. It is extraordinary that despite our space and personnel constraints, we have accomplished so much.

Now we stand poised to surpass these limitations and consider unprecedented, boundless possibilities.

The funds raised will be allocated as follows:

\$2 million for the final construction costs of the educational and performance space.

\$1.5 million for staffing and operational support at the new facility while maintaining PAC's first home on Terry Street – including curatorial, educational, and administrative roles.

\$1 million to create an endowment that will ensure long-term financial stability for ongoing operations, maintenance, and programming.

With your support, this campaign will not only facilitate the construction of the building but also will ensure that PAC and MoCA L.I. possess the resources necessary to more fully realize our potential. This innovative 7,282-square-foot complex is set to become the region's premier destination for contemporary art and community engagement.

The design masterfully integrates two distinct structures - a 5,282-square-foot Main Building and a 2,000square-foot Multipurpose Building - connected by a stunning central courtyard. This architectural composition creates a dynamic flow between indoor and outdoor spaces, maximizing the property's potential for diverse programming and revenue generation.

Design Excellence

The complex features dramatic northern-facing skylights that flood exhibition spaces with museum-quality natural light, creating an optimal environment for art display. A double-height lobby incorporating integrated digital display capabilities serves as an impressive welcome point for visitors. The exhibition spaces boast soaring 14-foot ceilings and adaptable configurations, allowing for diverse curatorial possibilities. Revenue generation is enhanced through versatile multipurpose spaces designed for events and programming. A working artist studio provides unique visitor engagement opportunities, while convertible indoor/outdoor performance spaces and a sculpture garden expand programming potential beyond traditional gallery confines.

Investment Opportunity

The strategic location serves Long Island's growing cultural community while offering diverse revenue streams through exhibitions, events, educational programs, and facility rentals. The design prioritizes operational efficiency and programming flexibility, with built-in expansion capabilities through adaptable spaces. This positions PAC MoCA as a significant driver of community impact and cultural tourism in the region.
