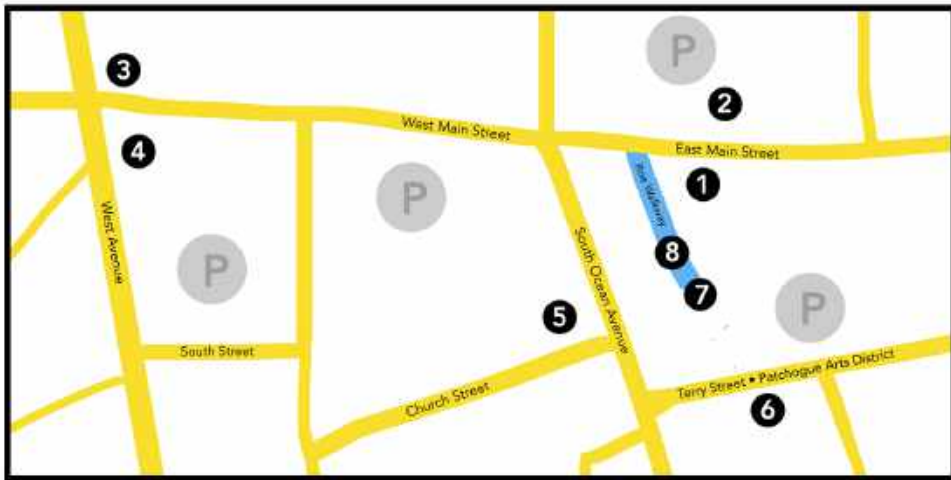
The Patchogue Arts Council transforms the Village of Patchogue into an open-air museum and arts destination.
